No other kind of bankruptcy is like this one. Alcohol, now become the rapacious creditor, bleeds us of all self-sufficiency and all will to resist its demands. Once this stark fact is accepted, our bankruptcy as going human concerns is complete.

But upon entering A. A. we soon take quite another view of this absolute humiliation. We perceive that only through utter defeat we are able to take our first steps toward liberation and strength. Our admissions of personal powerlessness finally turns out to be firm bedrock upon which happy and purposeful lives may be built.

1/24/1974—Bill Wilson dies in Miami, Florida

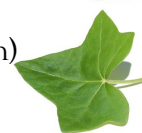
1/7/1984—"Pass it On", the story of Bill W. and how the AA message reached the world, was published

The Steering Committee minutes for November 14, 2016 were read. Corrections noted.  
Motion by David; seconded by Doug. Approved as corrected.  
The Intergroup Rep meeting minutes for November 21, 2016 were read.

**HOTLINE REPORT:** 12 step call list and volunteers' scheduled times for volunteering are being updated.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Marcy read Treasurer's Report. We netted \$1,360.23 on the Gratitude Dinner. Suggested we place funds into checking account and a transfer to the prudent reserve after we review our product inventory. Finance Committee will be working on increase of our product for sale due to our vendors' costs increases and taking into account our general increase in costs of operating.

**INTERGROUP REPORT:** Total telephone calls logged were 123; 71 of which were general/office inquires, 46 requests for meetings, and 6 were 12 step calls.

**WEBSITE REPORT:** Calendar and events are continually being updated. There are now links to other intergroups and districts.

### OLD BUSINESS:

Gratitude Dinner: We're waiting for receipts for items purchased for the Gratitude Dinner from our funds available in our "event fund." Handling of receipts, expenses paid by checks and preparation of a manual/guidelines for the Gratitude Dinner Committee were discussed.

Finance Committee Meetings: Finance Committee will meet at 5:15 pm at the Intergroup Office the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday of each month. AA members that are interested are welcome.

### COMMITTEES:

#### Finance Committee:

*Intergroup Budget:* Finance Committee will draft a proposed 2017 budget based upon 2016 expenses.

*Rental Agreement:* Greg met with landlord. Agreement has been signed. Landlord would not accept a limit on Intergroup's liability of repair expenses required by a business lease without an additional increase in our rent. Discussion and awareness of Intergroup's responsibility of cost of repairs if necessary.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Elections for Positions 2, 3 Alternate and Recording Secretary: John of A New Morning made himself available for the Alternate position.

Amending Minutes: Virginia requested that once Steering Committee has received drafts of minutes to please respond within 48 hours as opposed to 2 months later with any corrections to avoid confusion. Jeff noted guidelines state minutes within one week. It was discussed and suggested that with Steering Comm minutes since they are handed out to the Reps one week later, to have minutes drafted within 36 hours of Steering Committee meeting and any Steering Committee members recommending changes/amendments to respond within 24 hours given the tight deadline.

Group Inventory: Steering Committee members attended a Group Inventory chaired by Steve C, Area Alternate Delegate, focusing on the 12 Concepts, right of decision, trusted servants, putting disputes behind us, and noting a time slot for minority opinion/discussion at our Steering Comm and Rep meetings.

Office Closures (Weather): Suggested that Marcy go down the chain of command by telephone to discuss office closure due to weather conditions, taking into account closure of Vancouver Schools. Steering Committee to be advised, but unanimous vote not necessary.

Motions: Jeff handed out a suggested draft Motion presentation format, and possibility including in our procedure manual.

Wayfarers Committee/Conference Room Rental: Doug moved, Beci 2<sup>nd</sup>, all approved to rent our meeting room for \$25 per meeting (to Wayfarers and any other business/committee meetings). Marcy will notify Districts of our increase from \$20 to \$25. Our landlord has increased our rent; and thus our room rental increases.

Sale of Other 12 Step Program Product: Intergroup has had requests for books of Alanon, NA, Coda, etc that do not have their own Intergroup offices. Our sale of non-AA approved literature was discussed. We will further investigate, and bring up at Rep meeting for discussion.

Jamboree Rental of Storage Space: Doug moved, David 2<sup>nd</sup>, motion to rent storage space to the SW Washington Jamboree consisting of approximately 10 totes in our literature storage area for an agreed monthly rental. Passed.

July 2017 Picnic Chair: Will be announced at Rep meeting. Virginia remembers Sandy having a checklist for use by the Chair.

AA Service Manual: Suggested each Steering Committee purchase an AA Service Manual for reference as a trusted AA servant at a cost of approximately \$5.00 each.

Meeting adjourned with the Responsibility Statement.

# I STAND AT THE DOOR

I stand by the door.

I neither go to far in, nor stay to far out. The door is the most important door in the world -

It is the door through which men walk when they find God.

There is no use my going way inside and staying there, when so many are still outside and they,  
a much as I, crave to know where the door is. And all that so many ever find is only the wall where the door ought to be.

They creep along the wall like blind men, with outstretched, groping hands,

Feeling for a door, knowing there must be a door, yet they never find it.

So I stand by the door.

The most tremendous thing in the world is for men to find that door - the door to God.

The most important thing that any man can do is to take hold of one of those blind, groping hands

Die for want of what is within their grasp.

They live on the other side of it - live because they have not found it.

It is a vast, roomy house, this house where God is. Go into the deepest of hidden casements, Of withdrawal, of silence, of sainthood.

Some must inhabit those inner rooms and know the depths and heights of God, and call outside to the rest of us how wonderful it is.

Sometimes I take a deeper look in. Sometimes venture in a little farther, but my place seems closer to the opening.

So I stand by the door.

There is another reason why I stand there.

Some people get part way in and become afraid lest God and the zeal of His house devour them;

For God is so very great and asks all of us. And these people feel a cosmic claustrophobia and want to get out.

'Let me out!' they cry. And the people way inside only terrify them more.

Somebody must be by the door to tell them that they are spoiled. For the old life, they have seen too much:

One taste of God and nothing but God will do any more. Somebody must be watching for the frightened who seek to sneak out just  
where they came in, to tell them how much better it is inside.

The people too far in do not see how near these are to leaving - preoccupied with the wonder of it all.

Somebody must watch for those who have entered the door But would like to run away.

So for them too, I stand by the door.

I admire the people who go way in. But I wish they would not forget how it was before they got in.

Then they would be able to help the people who have not yet even found the door.

Or the people who want to run away again from God.

You can go in too deeply and stay in too long and forget the people outside the door.

As for me, I shall take my old accustomed place, near enough to God to hear Him and know He is there,

But not so far from men as not to hear them, and remember they are there too.

Where? Outside the door -

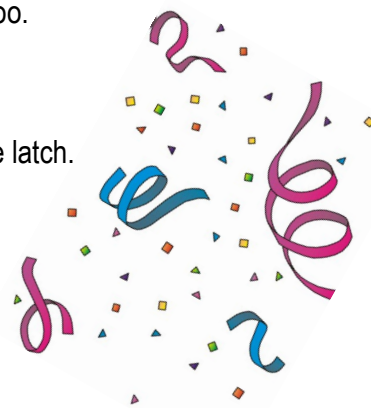
Thousands of them. Millions of them. But - more important for me -

One of them, two of them, ten of them. Whose hands I am intended to put on the latch.

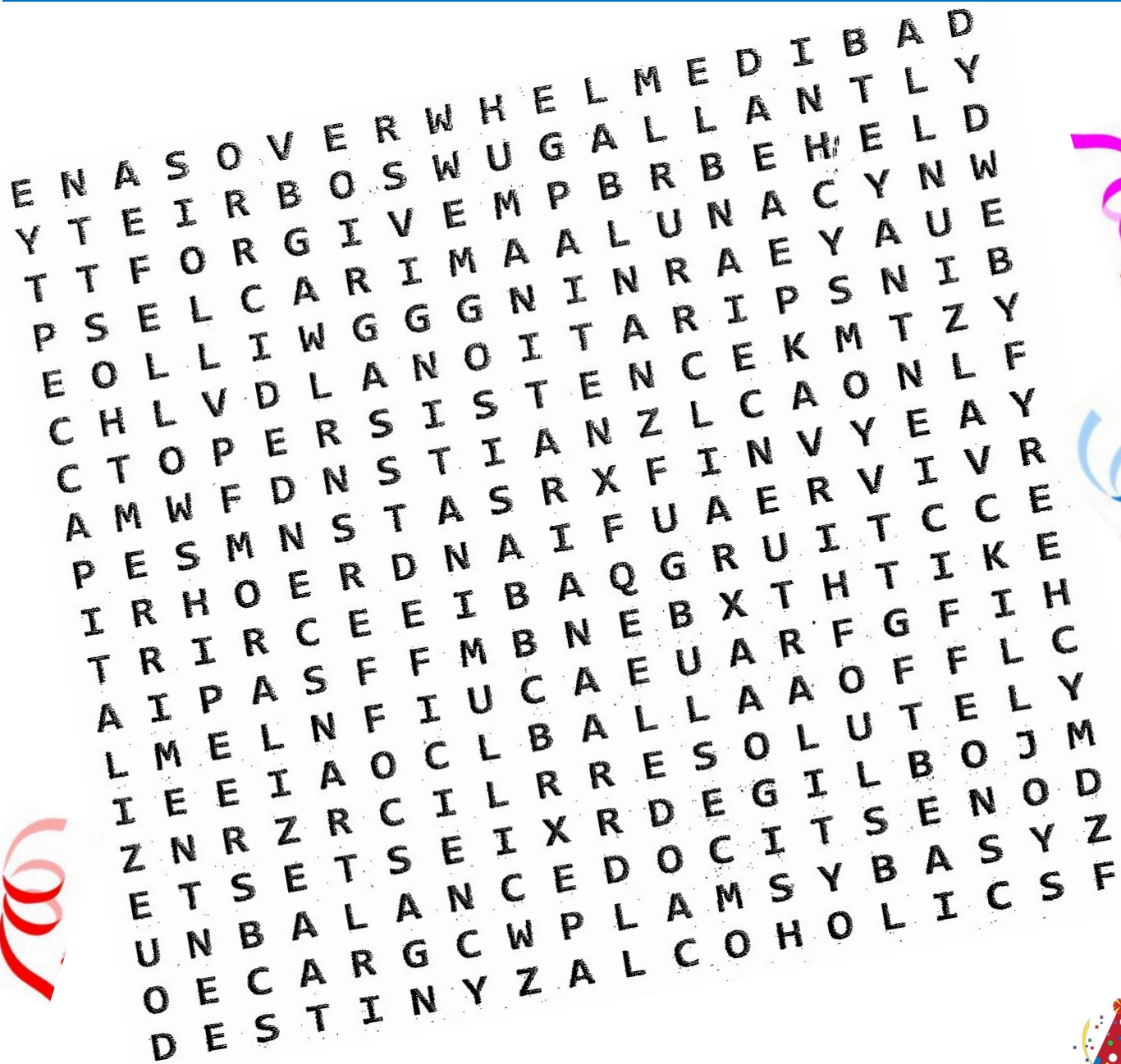
So I shall stand by the door and wait for those who seek it.
