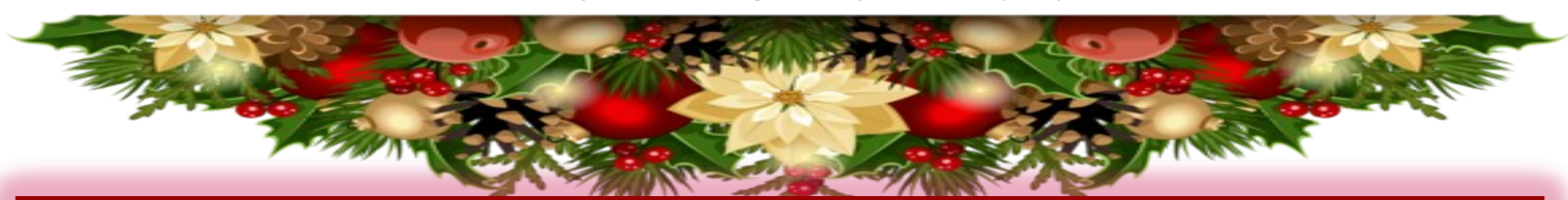

## AN A.A. MEMBER'S NIGHTMARE

"What if there was no INTERGROUP OFFICE in Vancouver?"

An Alcoholics Anonymous member named Fred had another drinking dream last week. This one was different from others. He dreamt that there was no Intergroup Office in Vancouver.

Fred awoke in a cold sweat. The thought of no "main headquarters" in Vancouver terrified him. He could not get the frightening thought out of his mind. Suppose suffering alcoholics had no central telephone number to call when they wanted help? Imagine: no literature quickly available. What if it was impossible for members to locate meetings because there was no directory? What would happen to A.A.'s image if no schools or other groups could invite speakers to talk about A.A.? Above all, just suppose that eager 12 Step volunteers never got calls from Central Office asking them to go to the aid of drunks who need and want A.A.?

But Fred calmed down. He was grateful that it was only a bad dream. Fred, you see, is a composite of all the enlightened members of A.A. who know the value of a Central Office - and use it.

He represents A.A.s who regularly call for information about A.A. activities and legacies. He could be a volunteer who answers telephones and handles mailings; a literature chairman picking up copies of the Big Book and pamphlets; a speaker being asked to carry the message; a group chairman looking for a speaker; a 12th Step volunteer; or a treasurer bringing one of the contributions which groups make to keep the Gifts of Sharing continuous.

Fred sighed in relief. "Thank Heaven, they have a Central Office." Then he remembered something. "Hey, it's not **THEY**. It's **WE...ME**. It's OUR Central Office. MINE. When I'm active, I help make all those good things happen."

So Fred began recalling what his Central Office does.

More than fifteen hundred times a year a voice on the telephone cheerfully offers understanding and compassion to the alcoholic who has sunk into the throes of despair and hopelessness.

Volunteers, who are sober members of A.A. and have a working knowledge of the 12 Steps and 12 Traditions, and who have had experience in 12 Stepping, have saved many a life just by proving that in Alcoholics Anonymous **we really care**. Volunteers and the Office Manager provide the primary service of the office - carrying the message of recovery to "the alcoholic who still suffers." The voice on the telephone **is** A.A. to the caller and it's calm, caring attention assures any alcoholic calling for help that he/she will get it.

Not all the calls coming in are calls for help. We get many inquiries for meeting times and locations. From the curious, or from traveling, sober A.A.'s calling just to hear the voice of another A.A. member.

We get calls from schools and outside organizations asking for speakers - someone to tell them what A.A. is all about, or for an A.A. member to share with them their experience, strength and hope ... and hopefully, maybe reach somebody who just 'isn't sure' about their own alcohol problem.

The Intergroup Office acts as a clearing house for all types of questions from the public, ranging from the families of an alcoholic seeking help for their loved one to a student doing a term paper on alcoholism. We're here, and many an A.A. member has been heard to say, "Boy, am I glad there was someone **there** when I made my call to A.A."

The Intergroup/Central Office is the 12th Step in action. Both the 12th Step and the 5th Tradition concern our primary purpose - to carry its message to the alcoholic who still suffers. The Vancouver Area Intergroup/Central Office carries out the 12th Step and 5th Tradition every moment of the day just by being available to those who need it.

The Steering Committee minutes of October 9, 2017 were reviewed. Phil moved to approve; Robert seconded; approved.

The Intergroup Rep meeting minutes for October 16, 2017 were reviewed.

**HOTLINE REPORT:** All Hotline slots are currently filled. Please continue to announce that AA volunteers are needed for the Hotline. Virginia reported an instance where two men's telephone numbers were given to a female caller; and requested if Maureen, our Hotline Chair, might visit our Steering Committee for a presentation of Hotline guidelines. Deb T. suggested Maureen give a presentation at one of our Intergroup Rep meetings. The male AAer immediately gave the female caller two AA women's phone numbers.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Treasurer's Report was reviewed. Deb moved to approve; Phil seconded; passed.

### INTERGROUP REPORT:

*Telephone Calls:* Of the 123 total calls to our office, 61 were general/office; 57 meeting requests, and five 12 step calls.

Intergroup was in need of new vacuum cleaner. One was donated by Tom. Thank you, Tom.

**WEBSITE REPORT:** Of the 1,385 visitors to our website in October, 921 were new visitors and 464 returning visitors. Scott, our webmaster, has set up online ordering. Marcy is working on entering the database for online ordering. Robert inquired if it was mobile friendly. Marcy will follow-up.

### OLD BUSINESS:

BLH Bookkeeping: BLH Bookkeeping has prepared our Federal and State payroll reports since the 1980's at no charge to Intergroup. It was moved, seconded, and approved to buy a \$25 gift card for BLH in appreciation of her services.

## **COMMITTEES:**

### Finance Committee:

*Intergroup Budget Draft:* Greg prepared a budget chart.

*Survey Groups for Desired Financial Reporting:* It was suggested we ask the Reps if they have a preferred Treasurer's Report format.

*Possible Offering Groups Liability Insurance Umbrella:* It was briefly discussed that many groups are required to carry liability insurance at the requirement of the building or space where they rent space for their AA meetings.

Gratitude Dinner: Deb T, Chair of our November 4, 2017 Gratitude Dinner advised the Gratitude netted approximately \$3,700; and suggested raising the Event Fund for the Gratitude Dinner. The matter will go before the Reps for a vote and to also obtain feedback regarding the raffle.

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

Replacing Map on the Wall at Intergroup Office: It was suggested to place a new map with steel bar frame and magnets, and that it be mobile.

Separating the Office Phone from AA Hotline: It was suggested that having an AA volunteer onsite during our business hours at our office would not only free up our office staff, but would also be good for security measures.

Black Friday: Marcy reported last year we made less than \$2 on Black Friday, the day after Thanksgiving. Phil moved, Robert seconded. It was passed to close our Intergroup Office on November 24<sup>th</sup>. It would simply be a day off for Marcy without pay as it is not a paid holiday, which she is very fine with.

Steering Committee Group Inventory: Last year the Steering Committee had a group inventory with Steve, the Area's Alternate Delegate at the time, serving as the facilitator. Phil requested the matter be tabled.

Elections: Virginia noted pursuant to our current Vancouver Area Intergroup Guidelines, Beci's time for serving on the Steering Committee would be up this December 2017 (being a maximum three year service period); and noted the Guidelines provide that our Vice Chair step up to complete the current term; therefore, leaving the Chair or Vice Chair position to be filled this December.

Omitting Puzzle From the Primary Purpose: It wouldn't save us much money, but omitting the puzzle on the last page of the Primary Purpose by saving paper and ink might be a good idea. The matter will be referred to the Reps.

Christmas Cards: After discussion, Robert moved, Deb seconded, and it was passed to buy non-religious Holiday cards for each Home Group (being approximately 110 Home Groups) with an estimated expense of \$50 to \$60, including postage.

A "Hotline Volunteer" presentation will be presented by Maureen P., our Hotline Chair, at December's Rep meeting. Please announce such in your Home Groups for those interested in serving as an volunteer and for those already on our 12 Step Volunteer list as the purpose is to properly inform our AA volunteers of Hotline volunteer guidelines.

**TREASURER'S REPORT** for October 2017 was provided to Reps. Robert moved, John seconded; Report approved.

### INTERGROUP REPORT:

Total incoming calls in August were 123, 61 of which were general/office, 57 meeting requests, and five 12 step calls. Thank you, Tom S. of Fireside, for donating a vacuum.

### WEBSITE REPORT:

Of 1,385 viewers to our website in August, 921 were new visitors, and 464 returning visitors. Scott has set up our website for online ordering. Marcy is working on entering the database.

### COMMITTEES:

#### Finance Committee:

*2018 Budget:* 2018 Budget was provided to Reps.

*Liability Insurance Umbrella Policy:* Discussion regarding Intergroup offering insurance to Home Groups for those Groups required to carry liability insurance by their landlords.



Gratitude Dinner: Deb T., Chair of the Gratitude Dinner, was absent. The Gratitude Dinner netted approximately \$3,700. Thank you, Deb and AA volunteers for your hard work. With additional funds needed for expenses for a successful annual Gratitude Dinner, it was moved, seconded and passed that the Event Fund remain at \$1,400; however, the Gratitude Dinner Chair/Committee is allowed to use incoming receipts from ticket sales up to \$400 for a total of \$1,800 to be allowed for Gratitude Dinner expenses.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

Electronic Banking: Many of our Intergroup invoices (accounts payable) are paid via electronic banking.

BHL Bookkeeping Services: A \$25 gift card will be sent to BHL Bookkeeping Services in appreciation of her "free" bookkeeping services to Intergroup since the 1980's.

Primary Purpose Puzzle: Removing the puzzle from the last page of our Primary Purpose to save paper and ink, was discussed, if including the puzzle would add an additional page to the Primary Purpose.

QuickBooks Format/Treasurer's Report: Noting several Reps have suggested a different QuickBooks format for our Treasurer's Report and reducing the numerous pages of our Financial Report were discussed. Reps were requested to take back to their groups, to especially inquire of how detailed of a report they desire. This matter tabled.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

Upcoming Steering Committee Elections: Positions available are Recording Secretary, Position #2, Position #3 and Alternate, to be voted on by Reps at our December meeting to step up effective January 1, 2018.

*Chair:* Beci has resigned as Chair. Noting our Vancouver Area Intergroup Guidelines state our Vice-Chair is to step up as Chair for remainder of the term through June 2018. With Deb T's absence (our Vice-Chair), we will wait for her in-person statement and decision as to stepping up as Chair. "If" the Chair position is available with a term commencing January 2018, Ronnie C. and Greg H. were nominated to serve as such. (Note: In post-meeting discussion it was revealed that although Beci's service term would end per our Guidelines on December 31, 2017, the correct term of our Chair position ends June 30, 2018 per our Intergroup Guidelines. Therefore, Phil should "not" have called for Chair nominations, as Deb T. has the option of serving as Chair until June 30, 2018)

*Vice-Chair:* Laurie H. was nominated; *Recording Secretary:* Marc T. was nominated

*Position No. 2:* Robert L. was nominated; *Position No. 3:* Glen H. and Marc T were nominated; *Alternate:* Glen H. and Chris were nominated.

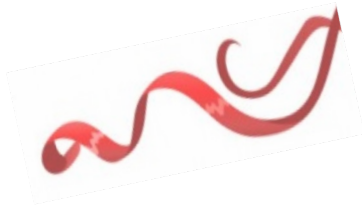

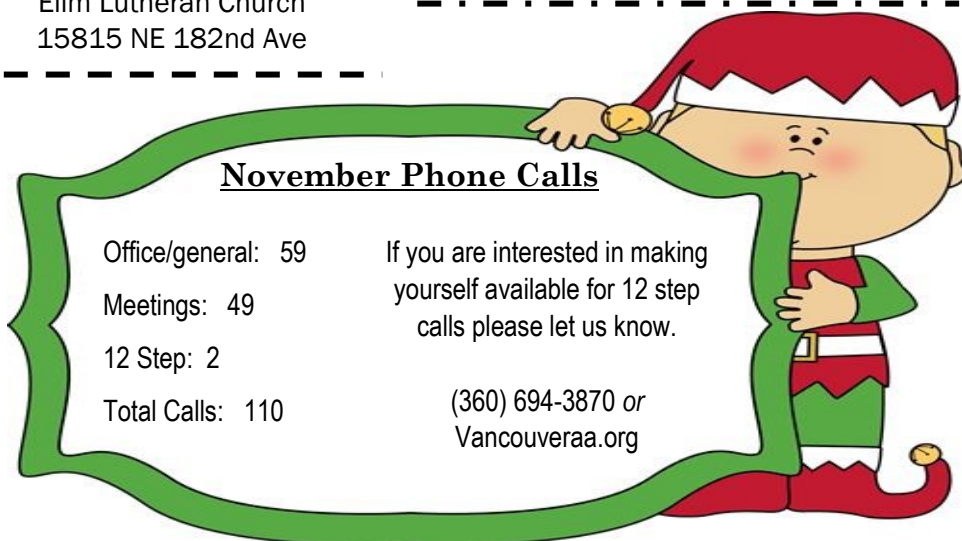
