STEERING COMITTEE MINUTES FOR JUNE 12, 2017

The meeting opened at 5:30 pm.

The Steering Committee minutes for May 8, 2017 were reviewed. Motion by Beci, seconded by John. Approved.

The Intergroup Rep meeting minutes for May 15, 2017 were reviewed.

HOTLINE REPORT: All hotline slots/shifts are currently filled. Please call our Intergroup Office to volunteer or sign up for our 12 Step list.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Treasurer's Report reviewed by Steering Committee. Moved by Beci; seconded by John; Treasurer's Report approved. After discussion, Virginia moved to cease transferring 2016 Gratitude Dinner net revenue originally set at \$500/month, of which \$360 remains of the total \$1,360 net revenue; seconded; unanimously approved. Marcy reported we are currently using "online bill pay" for payment of the Intergroup's bills which our bank offers at no charge to its customers. Using online bill pay saves postage. Virginia asked Marcy if she could provide a "daily sales" printout so we can see which days of the week are good days and which days are not so good for sales, which she will provide at the July Steering Committee meeting. Marcy stated to date we have not received any special pickup time requests for AA supplies from home groups or AA members.

In regards to contributions from Home Groups, Marcy stated we have 111 AA Groups. After discussion, it was requested that Marcy prepare a 3 year comparison chart for contributions. Darcy shared it is typical for contributions to be down in May because people have to pay their personal income taxes in April.

INTERGROUP REPORT: Total of 91 incoming telephone calls to our Intergroup office for May; 35 of which were general/office inquires, 50 requests for meetings, and 3 were 12 step calls.

WEBSITE REPORT: In May we had 440 new viewers and 849 returning visitors to our website, of which 50 were from Canada, 3 from India, and 5 from Brazil. We average approximately 1,300 viewers per month to our website. Scott, our website assistant, will visit Intergroup to update our website and include a sign-up sheet for our hotline volunteers.

OLD BUSINESS:

Summary of 2016 Motions: It was noted that the only 2016 motion that affected our Guidelines was in reference to the new job description approved by the Intergroup Reps in May 2016. Marcy will place the summary of our 2016 motions with our archives, along with the updated job description. John requested the effective date on our current Guidelines be changed from April 15, 2015 to January 18, 2016 as January 18, 2016 was the official date the Intergroup Reps approved our updated and revised Intergroup Guidelines.

<u>Suggested Increase of \$1,400 Event Account (for Gratitude Dinner)</u>: John provided an analysis of 2013 through 2016 Gratitude Dinner income and expenses. After discussion that the Gratitude Dinner may need an annual budget of \$1,600 if we rented a facility that could hold a capacity of 250 persons, and acknowledging that \$1,400 is a sufficient amount for the June Intergroup Picnic, it was moved to table the discussion whether or not to increase the Event Account from \$1,400 to \$1,600 for the Gratitude Dinner, Beci seconded, 4 yes, 2 no, passed.

Meeting Schedule Format: A sample of our meeting schedule in a new format was passed out to the Steering Committee. Steering Committee members shared what comments they have received from AA members on the new format. Jeff shared his original estimated cost per schedule was incorrect and the cost of printing schedules is less.

COMMITTEES:

Finance Committee:

- Budget Report: Greg provided a budget monitoring chart for May. A chart for comparing year to year was suggested.
- 2. Fundraising Pamphlet: Virginia suggested to change "Intergroup Reps & GSRs" are welcome to "Intergroup Reps & any interested AA member are welcome to attend our Intergroup meetings."
- 3. <u>Treasurers' Workshop</u>: Possible/tentative date is September 23, 2017. In reviewing workshop material, changing prudent reserve from 1 to 3 months was suggested, along with various other suggestions. Greg stated Districts will probably go through workshop material in more detail.

NEW BUSINESS:

Special Contributions to Intergroup: A home group donated \$200 cash to our June 2017 Intergroup Picnic. Greg thought all donations should go to our general fund and cannot be earmarked, otherwise returned to the home group. Virginia stated she will bring in AA Guidelines at our next Steering Committee meeting indicating home groups and individual AA members may earmark or designate donations for specific use. Robert suggested using the donation by buying tickets. John suggested that for accounting purposes we show our net income from the 2017 Picnic plus the \$200 cash donation; thereby including the \$200 as Picnic revenue.

Gratitude Dinner: Jeff introduced John, our Gratitude Dinner Chef. Various items and concerns were discussed, including our menu selections of prime rib, chicken and pork tenderloin. Marcy shared she knew a few AA members mentioned their disappointment at previous dinners where we ran out of food. We will have servers serving the meat in

controlled portions, as opposed to a buffet where you take what and how much you want, thereby decreasing waste. Colored tickets were discussed indicating an attendee's meat selection. Chef John shared his knowledge of fire codes, wherein our volunteers would not be provided a chair to sit in so they do not count as an attendee. Darcy shared her experience with rotating our dinner volunteers.

Repainting Intergroup's Meeting Room Floor: Darcy will bring in paint to donate for the repainting of our floor.

<u>Picnic</u>: Jeff announced we must bring our own table for our literature and product to sell. Wayfarers will donate their sound equipment with the agreement that if the sound equipment is broken in any way that there is a \$300 replacement fee and we would be required to sign a form of Release. Beci moved, John amended the Motion, Marcy 2nd, that we agree Intergroup sign the form of Release and pay the \$300 replacement fee if required. Passed.

<u>Human Resources Subcommittee</u>: All other business being completed, the Chair dismissed Marcy and all non-Steering Committee persons so the Steering Committee Human Resources Subcommittee could meet.

Meeting adjourned at 7:15 p.m.

The Intergroup Rep meeting minutes for May 15, 2017 were read. Robert moved as "corrected," Richard 2nd. Approved.

The Steering Committee minutes for June 12, 2017 were read.

HOTLINE REPORT:

Marcy reported all slots are currently filled. Please continue announcing in your home groups that we are always looking for AA volunteers for our hotline and 12 step calls. Scott (our webmaster) will be coming in to upload a form to our website for signing up for 12 step/hotline volunteers.

TREASURER'S REPORT: May's Treasurer's report was given. Beci moved and Jim 2nd to approve. 23 yes, 1 no, passed.

INTERGROUP REPORT: Total calls logged into our Intergroup Office for May were 91; 35 of which were general/office, 50 meeting requests, and three 12 step calls. We are currently switching to online bill pay to save postage.

WEBSITE REPORT:

440 new visitors and 849 returning visitors to our website, of which 50 were from Canada, 3 from India, and 5 from Brazil.

Finance Committee:

Budget: Budget report attached to our handouts to the Reps.

Treasurer's Workshop: Tentative date for our Treasurer's Workshop coordinated with Districts 7 and 37 is September 23, 2017.

OLD BUSINESS:

Gratitude Dinner Financials: John prepared and gave a Gratitude Dinner Comparison report of income and expenses for 2013 through 2016, which was attached to our Rep handout. Reps offered suggestions. It was noted that we will have volunteers serving at the Gratitude Dinner so we will not run out of food.

Meeting Schedule Format: Jeff welcomed comments regarding a possible change to our meeting schedule format. Several Reps shared their group's comments. Rep called for a vote. A "straw" vote was taken with 17 Reps approving the new format. It was suggested that Intergroup sell both formats of the meeting schedules to observe how many sell of each.
