WEBSITE REPORT:

OLD BUSINESS:

There were some concerns about our website person because we hadn't heard from him for a period of time. At our last Steering Committee meeting, we voted to look for someone else to fill that position. He showed up with a new, revised website he has been creating and is willing to continue as our website person. Because of this, the Steering Committee voted to rescind the vote to look for someone else to do the job.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Jeff went through the Office Manager job description/information and created a new job description that will be updated reflecting the lack of the office manager position and applicable for two people. This will be given to group reps to bring back and vote on at the April Intergroup meeting.
- We have opted to hire two part-time employees enabling us to offer six days a week (open Saturdays).
- We have also negated medical, vacation, sick pay; holiday pay will be paid only for the holidays falling on workdays.
- Motion was made that we have an open house to introduce the new office workers to the Intergroup patrons on Saturday, May 14th, either 9am to 1pm or 10 am to 2pm; (to be determined later). The office will also be open for business at that time.
- Employee evaluations will be at 90 days, 6 months, and on the anniversary of their hire date.
- It was moved to pay Earlyn for the 106.75 PTO hours as a cash-out option, for a gross total of \$1,551.08 out of the Employee Reserve Account. The final date for cash out will be March 31st, 2016.
