
Step 10



- 1945 AA Grapevine adopted as national publication of AA
- 1947 The Melbourne group held its first meeting in Australia
- 1951 Lasker award given to AA by American Public Health Association
- 1951 Sister Ignatia wrote "Care of Alcoholics St.Thomas Hospital & A.A. Started Movement Which Swept Country" article in "Hospital Progress" the journal of Catholic Hospital Association
- 1954 The "Alcoholic Foundation" is renamed "The General Service Board of AA"
- 1957 Book "A.A. Comes of Age" is published
- 1963 Dr. Sam Shoemaker passes
- 1969 1st World Service meeting held in New York. Delegates from 14 countries were in attendance
- 1988 Lois Burman Wilson, Bills wife and a co-founder of Al-Anon, dies at age 97

The Steering Committee minutes for August 8, 2016 were read. Motion by Greg to approve; seconded by Beci. All approved.

The Intergroup Rep meeting minutes for August, 2016 were read.

HOTLINE REPORT:

Maureen reports that all positions on the hotline are now filled. Maureen and Marcy will meet to compare 12 step call lists of AA volunteers.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Marcy read Treasurer's Report. Five pay periods in August; therefore, payroll was higher than usual (every Wednesday being the pay day).

Beci made a Motion to return all but \$5.00 of the \$401.47 in the Employee Reserve back to the Prudent Reserve. Motion seconded by Virginia. All approved.

INTERGROUP REPORT:

Total telephone calls logged were 109; 60 of which were general/office inquires, 39 requests for meetings, and 10 were 12 step calls.

WEBSITE REPORT:

Scott has worked with the Intergroup Office to help create a manual with step by step instructions for updating the website from the back end. Scott is currently out of town and will return the end of September. Calendar and events are updated. There is now a downloadable meeting schedule on the website. Scott will be working on downloadable flyers which a user may access from the "Event Calendar."

The Steering Committee minutes for September 12, 2016 were read.

HOTLINE REPORT:

Maureen reports that all hotline positions are currently filled. Maureen and Marcy met to combine their 12 step lists. Maureen will finalize the 12 Step Call List.

AA member reported that he telephoned the AA Hotline and he was promised a return telephone call; however, he received no such return call to date. In addition, the Hotline person was unaware whether it was a 12 step call or general inquiry. Discrepancy information provided by AA Hotline member will be passed along to Hotline Chair to keep Hotline members properly informed.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Marcy read the Treasurer's Report. It was moved and seconded to approve the report. Approved (13 Reps)

INTERGROUP REPORT:

Marcy reported there were 109 telephone calls to Intergroup during August, 60 of which were general/office inquiries, 39 meeting requests and ten 12 step calls.
