Tradition Ten – An Essay by Bill W. September 1948

To most of us, Alcoholics Anonymous has become as solid as the Rock of Gibraltar. We like to believe that it will soon be as well-known and just as enduring as that historic landmark. We enjoy this pleasant conviction because nothing has yet occurred to disturb it; we reason that we must hang together or die. Hence we take for granted our continued unity as a movement.

But should we? Though God has bestowed upon us great favors, and though we are bound by stronger ties of love and necessity than most societies, it is prudent to suppose that automatically these great gifts and attributes shall be ours forever? If we are worthy, we shall probably continue to enjoy them. So the real question is, how shall we always be worth of our present blessings?

Seen from this point of view, our AA Traditions are those attitudes and practices by which we may deserve, as a movement, a long life and a useful one. To this end, none could be more vital than our Tenth Tradition, for it deals with the subject of controversy-serious controversy.

Being like other men and women, how can we expect to remain forever immune from these perils? Probably we shall not. At length, we must meet them all. We cannot flee from them, nor ought we try. If these challenges do come, we shall, I am sure, go out to meet them gladly and unafraid. That will be the acid test of our worth.

Our best defense? This surely lies in the formation of a Tradition respecting serious controversy so powerful that neither the weakness of persons nor the strain and strife of our troubled times can harm Alcoholics Anonymous. We know that AA must continue to live, or else many of us and many of our fellow alcoholics throughout the world will surely resume the hopeless journey to oblivion. That must never be. As though by some deep and compelling instinct, we have thus far avoided serious controversies. Save minor and healthy growing pains, we are at peace among ourselves. And because we have thus far adhered to our sole aim, the whole world regards us favorably.

May God grant us the wisdom and fortitude ever to sustain an unbreakable unity.

William Griffith Wilson (November 26, 1895 – January 24, 1971), also known as Bill Wilson or Bill W., was the co-founder of Alcoholics Anonymous (AA). AA is an international mutual aid fellowship with about 2 million members worldwide belonging to approximately 10,000 groups, associations, organizations, cooperatives, and fellowships of alcoholics helping other alcoholics achieve and maintain sobriety. Following AA's Twelfth Tradition of anonymity, Wilson is commonly known as "Bill W." or "Bill." In order to identify each other, members of AA will sometimes ask others if they are "friends of Bill". Although this question can be confusing, because "Bill" is a common name, it does provide a means of establishing the common experience of AA membership. After Wilson's death in 1971, and amidst much controversy within the fellowship, his full name was included in obituaries by journalists who were unaware of the significance of maintaining anonymity within the organization. Wilson's sobriety from alcohol, which he maintained until his death, began December 11, 1934. In 1955 Wilson turned over control of AA to a board of trustees. Wilson died of emphysema complicated by pneumonia from smoking tobacco in 1971.

In 1999 Time listed him as "Bill W.: The Healer" in the Time 100: The Most Important People of the Century.

- 5. What would AA be without this Tradition? Where would I be?
- 6. Do I breach this or any of its supporting Traditions in subtle, perhaps unconscious, ways?
- 7. How can I manifest the spirit of this Tragilition in my personal life outside AA? Inside AA?

Steering Committee Meeting Minutes

Vancouver Area Intergroup of Alcoholics Anonymous Steering Committee meeting of October 11, 2021

Attendance: Dusty, Laurie, Leanne, Phil, Julie, Patrick, Bruce, Michael, Steering Committee members & Alex, probable Treasurer 2022

Opening: The meeting was opened at 6:00pm with the Serenity Prayer. Minutes from September SC meeting were accepted. Minutes from the September IG meeting were reviewed.

<u>Treasury</u>: Please see attached report. Laurie advised she will be working on a 2022 forecast which will be subject to IG approval. Report accepted.

Office: Leanne advised that she has submitted a copy of the seller's permit to World Services which when accepted should allow purchases without tax. She noted that reopening on Fridays has proven to be successful with significant sales and traffic on that day.

<u>Hotline</u>: Please see attached report. The report left several unanswered questions which will be emailed to the hotline chair with request that these issues be addressed at their 10/25/21 committee meeting.

<u>Old Business/Hotline</u>: The issue of unanswered phone calls was discussed. The attached hotline report offers a solution of voice mail answering service. This is one of the items emailed to the hotline chair requesting it be discussed at their committee meeting. PENDING

New Business/Events: Laurie and Leanne are planning a bingo event, advised they would be drawing funds from the event account and providing receipts for all money spent. It was noted that this is exactly the purpose of the account and as we are not able to hold our gratitude dinner it is important to hold events such as this. CLOSED

New Business/New Vendor: Pass It On was approved as a new vendor for the purchase of materials should World Services continue to charge tax. It was further noted that they do not have a minimum order to avoid shipping costs. Pass It On makes their purchases from World Services so should we make purchase here World Services would still be financially supported. CLOSED

New Business/Roberts Rules of Order: It was noted that there appears to be conflicting information regarding an abstention when there is a motion voted on. RR of O was briefly discussed and it was noted that the simplified version of RR of O is 30 pages. Phil noted that at last month's IG meeting it was brought up that the guidelines need to be updated and that perhaps the best course of action is to let this matter drop without motion and that the updated guidelines include motion/voting procedures. New Business/Updated Guidelines: Phil volunteered and was accepted to write the guideline updates. Please note that Phil makes recommendations only and the updates are subject to IG approval. OPEN

At this year's Area Assembly (October 1-3), Area 72 voted to form an online district, to enable general service and business in an online-only format.
